Note on 'n"s and 'g"s:

- •ng Velar nasal as in Ngalakgan or English sing.
- •nk Two sounds- 'n'+'k' as in gunku 'the' (GU-gender).
- •ngg Two sounds- 'ng'+'g' as in rlangga 'billabong' or English sound in finger

Note on 'short' stops:

'Short' stops are written differently, depending on whether they are at the start or end of a word or syllable. At the start of a word or syllable, we use **b**, **d**, **rd**, **j** and **g**. At the end of a word or syllable, we use **p**, **t**, **rt**, **tj** and **k**.
